

This week, I called Jim Scott and asked him if I could share something that he had said during our discipleship group (or what we can call a 'D-Group'). I called and asked him because part of the design of a D-Group is that there is a high degree of confidentiality there. We want to be able to share vulnerably with one another what's really going on in our lives and what God is doing in us. So before I shared it with you, I asked Jim.

What Jim shared had to do what God was doing in his life through this group. He said he felt like this work was kind of like the movie *The Wizard of Oz*. For the first twenty minutes or so of the movie, it's filmed in black and white, and then it changes to color. When audiences first saw this change in the movie, it was shocking. Color movies were uncommon, and the color made the movie to be rich and full of detail and beautiful.

Jim said that this work in the discipleship group was like that. Some of what we are looking at are things he already knew about. But the way that it is working in his life and the deeper discoveries about God that he is making - they are richer and more full of color.

I wanted to share Jim's story with the whole congregation because the work we are doing in our D-Groups is work worth doing! The goal of a Discipleship Group is to help people grow in Christian maturity. You can think of it as leading people who are converts to become disciplined in their lives, and then to lead these disciples to become disciple-makers.

That is like what Jesus did and what he prioritized. He called together a small group of friends and spent time with them. During that time, he poured himself mostly into these twelve guys. Yes, he did other ministries - he taught large crowds, he healed people, he went to dinner parties, he raised the dead, he calmed storms, and cast out demons. But ultimately, his greatest work, his most consistent work, was making disciples of just a few people. He was making disciples who would be prepared to make disciples.

They were common, ordinary people who had their black-and-white lives filled up with color. And when Jesus was done with them, they were ready, prepared to be disciple-makers. Jesus thought common people were absolutely able to make disciples of the kingdom of God.

There are a few reasons I wanted you, the congregation, to know about this. First, to encourage your prayers for the success of this ministry. It's up and running well, but it still needs the support of prayer. Next, I wanted to encourage you to begin thinking about devoting your time to being in a D-Group later this fall. A short time after the summer is over, we will be launching new D-Groups, and I'd like to encourage you now to begin praying and asking God if you should be involved in one.
