

Today is the first Sunday following the first full moon after the Spring Equinox. This is the day we remember the moment when everything changed - the entirety of world history hinges on the event that we celebrate today.

Today we remember something that happened on a Sunday morning long, long ago. It was an event that happened very early in the morning. It was at that time of day when people are still asleep and only military men who have to keep watch through the night could tell you that it was nearing the morning time. It happened when the darkness was just starting to give way to the light.

The light shattered the darkness and broke the grip of sin and death on God's creation. A King who had died began to breathe again. He had been murdered by the agents of an enemy kingdom. That cruel execution was suddenly undone. With this King's rising, a whole new era began.

This gentle King was an entirely different kind of King than the world had ever known. He did not raise armies. He didn't attempt to take over cities or expand his geographic territory. He was no tyrant who governed through intimidation, threat, or the use of power. He didn't levy taxes upon his citizens. His goal didn't seem to be to run any kind of powerful human government at all.

His resistance to his enemies was never by force, but by faith and love. In fact, the thing that we remember today is that in that early morning darkness, the King was in the grave because of the way he fought his battles. When they attacked him, he did not fight back. He did not resist evil by being evil himself, but he allowed evil to do what it did, and then he did what only he could do: he trusted God and God vindicated him by raising him from the dead.

As he walked out of the grave in that early morning darkness, passing by the unconscious soldiers who had been guarding his grave, Jesus Christ walked into a whole new world. The world of darkness was still there, but now the Light was shining through the dark. The Light that gives light to all men had come into the world and the world had done its worst to him. Now, the Light was alive again, shining in the darkness, and the darkness could not overcome it.

Today, we remember in a special way what we celebrate every Sunday morning - that our King is alive. He was dead, and he is alive again. Death will never touch him again, and he has charted a course for us through death and into eternal life. He reigns over us by his love and grace, leading us into a life we could never find on our own. Without him, we would be following the ways of this world. We would be no different from anyone else born into this broken earth. But because he is alive, we are alive too.

That's something worth celebrating! May the joy of his life be with you today as you remember the resurrection of Jesus Christ your King.
