

What happened in the resurrection is that the whole of history was interrupted, the pages of time were bent over on themselves, and the end of things met the middle of the story. The events that are going to happen at the very end started happening while the story was still going on.

Imagine if there were someone at the end of time with a video camera, and they capture the events that will happen then - the unprecedented and amazing events that will only happen when all of time and history in this broken world are done. This is a thing that Jews had come to expect would portend the end of time - the very end would include a resurrection of the dead. But it would only happen at the very end, on the very last day of time.


So someone is there and shot video of that, and then God brought that video to us and pushed play. The very first dead human to ever experience resurrection has the experience. His brutalized body lay dead, but suddenly his lips part, and a breath fills his lungs and his eyes open and he stands up.

But then, before this experience can spread to everyone else (as it surely will, because this is the very end of time), God hits the pause button on the video. Ever since he did that, we have lived with this anticipation and expectation: someday, God will allow that whole video to play and finish and everyone will stand up alive again. Not just a picture of it, but the events themselves will take place. Just exactly what happened to Jesus will keep happening, and all of the dead will rise from their graves. He was only the first fruits, and when you collect first fruits of apples, you don't get oranges from that tree later. What happened to Jesus isn't different from what will happen to us; that same thing will happen to us all.

And we can know this for sure, because we live in a world where it has already happened. The end of time came to the middle so that we could be sure about where things were going. A thing that's happened once can surely be believed and expected to happen again. So when the dead will rise, they will rise like Christ did: free from death, free from sickness, free from sin and temptation and rot and all of it.

This is the great gift of God in the resurrection of Jesus: the certainty of things only hoped for, and the wondrous dream made visible for us. Death and destruction will be defeated. We know, because in Jesus' resurrection, they have been already.
